Thank you for your email of the 13 September, in which you request information under the provisions of the FOI Act 2000.

In your email you asked the following question:

Based on the most recent version of the Electoral Roll (August 4th 2016), how many people are currently registered to vote in each proposed constituency?

The most recent electorate data held by the Boundary Commission for England (BCE) is that as at 1 December 2015, as this is the data that legislation requires us to use throughout the 2018 Review of Parliamentary constituencies. A full listing of the registered Parliamentary electorate (as at that date) for each proposed constituency appears in our published regional Initial proposals reports, available from the 'Publications' section of our website at www.bce2018.org.uk (select 'Regional reports' from the drop-down list under the 'Document type' heading on this page). The BCE does not hold more recent electorate data.

If you would like to obtain more recent electorate figures, you should contact the local authority Electoral Registration Officer for any specific area you are interested in. Alternatively, you may wish to make a request to the Electoral Commission, who may collate national figures.
