In May 2021 we published our Guide to the 2023 Review. It explains the process of the 2023 Review. The Guide also aimed to clarify the statutory framework within which the Commission conducted the Review, and the policies followed by the Commission in developing proposals and final recommendations. It also set out how and when the public were able to contribute their views. You can read the guide here

We used a Geographic Information System called QGIS. This is an open-source application that is available freely to members of the public, although our use of it has been modified to allow us to create possible configurations of constituencies. It includes ward and polling district electorates as provided by every local authority in England, and boundary information provided by Ordnance Survey and local authorities, which allowed us to construct schemes of constituencies which comply with the permitted electorate range.
